COVID-19 hygiene concept

It is important to the Federal Government to create the safest possible environment for all participants of the G7 Summit and to prevent or reduce any spread of the virus among those involved during the meeting. In order to achieve this and support infection control, testing for SARS-CoV-2 infection will be a key element of the comprehensive hygiene concept, carried out in close coordination with the local authority responsible, namely the District Office of Garmisch-Partenkirchen. In addition to general hygiene and infection control measures, the following guidelines also provide details of how testing will be implemented.

Arrival

Before entering the infrastructure for the first time, media representatives – like the delegations themselves – are required to show proof of a negative **PCR test** which was taken **no more than 48 hours** previously.

See under "Testing strategy" for details.

General hygiene measures

In order to ensure the G7 Summit runs smoothly, everyone involved is required to observe and implement the following measures responsibly for their own safety and that of others:

- A minimum **distance of 1.5 metres** is to be observed from other participants wherever possible.
- Wearing an FFP2 mask is strongly recommended indoors and in areas where the required minimum distance cannot be maintained.
- Wearing an FFP2 mask is compulsory in the transport vehicles provided, at Schloss Elmau and the retreat, at the Briefing Centre, at the live announcer points and at the press area for arrivals at Munich airport.
- Care should be taken to wash and disinfect one's hands regularly.
- **Handshakes should be avoided** as far as possible, as should contacts that are not absolutely necessary.
- Coughing and sneezing etiquette is to be observed.
- In case of **cold symptoms or symptoms that potentially indicate a coronavirus infection,** you are urged to contact the Bavarian Red Cross medical service at one of the hygiene and first-aid stations without delay.

Any changes to the measures will be announced promptly as appropriate.

Testing strategy

A thorough testing concept will be implemented in order to counteract the spread of the SARS-CoV-2 virus as effectively as possible. The aim is to provide access to the Summit for all participants – **regardless of vaccination or recovery status** – and ensure equal conditions for all.

In addition to the **PCR test requirement on arrival** (see above), everyone will be required to take a **lateral flow test on a daily basis in the period from 25 to 28 June 2022** (under the Federal Government's free public testing programme): the aim here is to enable the media to go about their work while still ensuring full protection. Tests can be taken at municipal test centres. This also applies to the press area for arrivals at Munich airport. Everyone must carry a test certificate with them at all times that is no older than 24 hours.

Please note that it is only possible to enter the infrastructure provided, such as the International Media Centre, with proof of a negative test result. Without this, access cannot be granted.

The aim is to ensure that potential infections can be identified and isolated before they become contagious. If everyone plays their part, it will be possible to minimise the risk of passing on infections as effectively as possible.

The lateral flow test can be taken anywhere as long as the required documentation can be provided. Here is a list of local test centres in Garmisch-Partenkirchen:


What to do in the event of a positive test result

Anyone testing positive on site immediately before or during the days of the Summit itself **must isolate immediately** – complying with the general rules regarding social distancing, face coverings – and must **not enter or must immediately leave** the infrastructure and connected areas provided for the Summit. The public health department will deploy an outbreak and investigation team on a round-the-clock basis to trace infected individuals and contact persons as quickly as possible.

Note:

Testing has no effect on accreditation and is independent of it.

Accreditation

Only the G7 accreditation pass will be valid for the G7 Summit. Journalists interested in registering for accreditation for the event were able to do so online.

Accreditation passes will be issued solely on presentation in person of a valid identity card or passport in conjunction with the original confirmation issued by the commissioning media company. All journalists were required to register for this event. Permanent accreditations issued by the Press and Information Office of the Federal Government will not be valid for the G7 Summit.

Issue of accreditation passes

Passes will be issued at the G7 Summit Accreditation Office in the International Media Centre, Hausberg 4 (Hausbergbahn car park, see IMC overview 1), 82467 Garmisch-Partenkirchen, at the following times:

The G7 accreditation pass gives media representatives access to the International Media Centre plus all its facilities. The pass must be worn and clearly visible at all times. A photo ID card must also be carried at all times. Special accreditation passes (pool cards) will be required for restricted press events. Please inform the Accreditation Office immediately if you lose your accreditation pass.

International Media Centre

An International Media Centre will be set up for the duration of the Summit at the Hausbergbahn car park (address: Hausberg 4, 82467 Garmisch-Partenkirchen).

All media representatives with a yellow G7 accreditation pass and delegates with a blue or red pass have access to the International Media Centre.






Map of Garmisch-Partenkirchen

Technical facilities

Approx. 850 workstations with LAN connections and power sockets will be available in Tent 1 and Tent 3. WiFi (WLAN) is available throughout the International Media Centre and in the Briefing Centre. Photocopiers are provided in Tent 1 and Tent 3. Workstations cannot be booked in advance.

Electronic media/radio

The European Broadcasting Union (EBU) will be in Tent 3. A limited number of 40 TV and radio booths will also be available there. These booths will be managed and wired up by the EBU and will be supplied with footage of the entire event.

Use of radio frequencies

All representatives of the electronic media (television, radio, online, etc.) are required to register the radio frequencies they use with the Federal Network Agency. Use without a valid frequency allocation is an administrative offence and may be subject to a fine. Unregistered radio frequencies may be blocked if necessary. TV and radio

As a result of restrictions due to security considerations, protocol and space limitations, German public broadcasters and private TV stations have agreed to jointly provide a global broadcast (host TV through the so-called Berlin Model for all photo/film sessions and press conferences in connection with the G7 Summit.

The Berlin Model provides two signals via satellites for free use (Weltbild 1 and Weltbild 2). Exact transponder data will be published in the press programme in due course.

Rights of use for Weltbild 1

Weltbild 1 may be used free of charge as a clean feed exclusively for classic television broadcasting. TV agencies are subject to an embargo for German-speaking countries, which also applies to downstream marketing. Weltbild 1 may not be used online unless the relevant cost allocation is paid to the Berlin Model.

Rights of use for Weltbild 2

Weltbild 2 is available for online use free of charge and simultaneously. A watermark indicates Berlin Model copyright. Any manipulation of the signal provided for online use, such as alteration/covering of the watermark and/or scaling for the purpose of removing the watermark, etc. constitutes an infringement.

Misuse or unlawful use of non-transferred rights of Weltbild 1 or Weltbild 2 is subject to legal sanction by the Berlin Model!

Important:

The G7 Summit photo/film sessions will be covered exclusively by the Berlin Model's live TV technology and staff to create the global broadcast in the security areas. No other TV technology will be permitted!

This applies to all photo/film sessions at Schloss Elmau, in the Briefing Centre at Schloss Elmau (press conference rooms) and at Munich Airport as well as all other photo/film sessions in connection with the G7 Summit.

Important:

Due to spatial and structural restrictions, it will not be possible to meet all requests for independent live stand-up positions. We advise using the services of providers who manage stand-up positions with their technology and rent out airtime.

Important:

The stand-up position inside the press centre in Garmisch-Partenkirchen can only be used with a valid accreditation for the G7 Summit. This also applies to interview partners!

TV and radio workstations in the International Media Centre in Garmisch-Partenkirchen

Important:

Valid accreditation for the G7 Summit will be required in order to be able to use the TV and radio workstations.

Live stand-ups at the Briefing Centre at Schloss Elmau

As a result of restrictions due to security, space limitations and nature conservation considerations, only an extremely limited number of stand-up positions are available at the Briefing Centre at Schloss Elmau. Furthermore, no other transmission vehicles can be parked on the premises.

For this reason, only a small number of providers can be admitted to the Briefing Centre in addition to the host TV provided by the Berlin Model. These providers will manage stand-up positions with their live technology and rent out airtime to interested TV broadcasters.

Important:

The use of these stand-up positions requires long-term planning and is very time-consuming (at least 2 to 3 hours in advance, depending on the traffic situation).

In addition to a valid G7 Summit accreditation, you will also need the special "Briefing Centre Elmau Announcer" pass. The latter are only issued on a temporary basis. A mandatory security check is then carried out at the International Media Centre in Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Transport to the Briefing Centre will take place exclusively in secure transportation provided by the Press and Information Office of the Federal Government. After the end of the session, return transport to the International Media Centre in Garmisch-Partenkirchen is again only possible using the secure transportation provided by the Press and Information Office of the Federal Government. Upon return to the Media Centre, the supplementary pass must be handed back.

Journalists may not make any other individual trips to Schloss Elmau!

Host TV and live stand-ups at Munich Airport

The photo/film sessions for the arrival of the G7 Heads of State and Government will be covered exclusively by the Berlin Model's live TV technology and staff to create the global broadcast in the security areas. Other TV technology to cover the photo/film sessions cannot be permitted.

However, there are a limited number of live stand-up positions. TV broadcasters or TV agencies were invited to express their interest in a live stand-up position in this area. Registration is now closed. No further requests will be considered.

Important:

Due to security and spatial restrictions, it will not be possible to offer all those registering an interest their own live stand-up positions.

Valid accreditation for the G7 Summit plus the special pass "Aufsager Flughafen München" (Stand up Munich Airport) will be required in order to be able to use the live stand-up positions at Munich Airport.

Closed Circuit TV (CCTV)

All press events will be relayed to the International Media Centre via CCTV.

Special passes for restricted photocalls/press events

Due to the huge media interest and spatial restrictions, it will not be possible for all journalists to attend all the photocalls and press events. Visual media representatives of the participating countries will be given priority. Access to the restricted events will only be possible with a valid special pass for the respective event in combination with a valid G7 pass.

All restricted photocalls will be covered by the Berlin Model (host broadcaster, see also "TV and radio") and the Federal Government's official photographers. The Berlin Model provides two signals via satellites for free use (Weltbild 1 and Weltbild 2). Exact transponder data will be published in the press programme in due course. The images from the official photographers can be obtained directly via the German G7 Presidency website (www.g7germany.de).

Issue of special passes to media from the participating countries

National delegations will be responsible for issuing the special passes to journalists from the participating countries at the appropriate time. Journalists from the participating countries should direct any questions they may have regarding whether they can be considered for restricted photocalls to the national press delegations.

Issue of special passes for German and international media

Special passes will be issued in Tent 2 in the International Media Centre at the following times:

Saturday, 25 June 2022, from 12:00 to 20:00, Sunday, 26 June 2022, from 06:00 to 10:00, Monday, 27 June 2022, from 06:00 to 10:00, Tuesday, 28 June 2022, from 06:00 to 10:00.

Pool Meeting Point

Access to photocalls and press events will be in groups accompanied by members of staff of the Press and Information Office of the Federal Government. The Pool Meeting Point is in Tent 1 in the International Media Centre (see IMC overview 2).

Transfer to photocalls and press events


Journalists will be transferred to each photocall and press event in buses after gathering at the Pool Meeting Point. For security reasons, a security check will be carried out (identity and bag check) and the required G7 pass and special passes will be checked.

Please refer to the detailed press programme for how much time you will need to plan prior to each transfer and which photocalls and press events will be mutually exclusive due to times clashing. These will also be announced via CCTV.

Journalists who arrive at the Pool Meeting Point after the specified times will not be considered and cannot be transferred. They will not be permitted to make their own way to the photocall or press event.

Special arrangements at Munich Airport

Transportation will be provided from the International Media Centre to Munich Airport. Journalists may also make their own way to the airport. In both cases, a security check will be necessary at the airport. The security check at the airport will be carried out in Terminal 1 – Module A Nord – Level 04. Journalists will be transferred from there to the press position.

Important:

The security check will resemble the procedures for any regular flight. Please pay attention to hand luggage restrictions. Catering, in particular beverages, will be available at the press position. The Federal Government is organising the G7 Summit in a sustainable way. We encourage you to use means of transportation that are environmentally friendly.



Important:

Journalists who make their own way to the airport will need the G7 accreditation pass plus the special pass. These can only be obtained in the International Media Centre Garmisch-Partenkirchen. It will probably not be able to leave the press position until all the G7 heads of state and government have arrived.

Briefing Centre Schloss Elmau

The Briefing Centre is located on the grounds of Schloss Elmau. Briefing sessions and press conferences by the Summit participants will take place here. Access is only possible for pool participants via shuttle buses which will depart from the International Media Centre. The transfer time will be around one hour (following the security check). It will not be possible to transfer independently.

Information on travel

There are no parking facilities at the International Media Centre, so we would like to draw your attention to the free park-and-ride service offered by Landesgestüt Schwaiganger (Ohlstadt) and the shuttle service provided by Bayerische Zugspitzbahn, both of which reduce traffic volume and promote sustainability.

Bayerische Zugspitzbahn shuttle

The Hausberg station is located directly at the IMC: you can use this for arrival and departure. We will be providing a regular shuttle service in cooperation with Bayerische Zugspitzbahn.

Each eligible person will receive a letter with the accreditation documents to obtain a permanent ticket of the Bayerische Zugspitzbahn (BZB) at the "Zugspitzbahnhof Garmisch-Partenkirchen" for the period from 09 June 2022 to 29 June 2022.

This pass is valid for travel between the stations Zugspitzbahnhof Garmisch-Partenkirchen (directly next to Garmisch-Partenkirchen railway station) and Hausberg. If you wish to use the pass to travel as far as Grainau, please indicate this when it is issued.



About the conference venue

Schloss Elmau

Schloss Elmau is situated in a high valley between Garmisch-Partenkirchen and Mittenwald in the Upper Bavarian Wetterstein mountains. It was built between 1914 and 1916 by the theologian and philosopher Johannes Müller as a meeting place for his readers and participants in his seminars. Prominent politicians and creative artists were also frequent visitors to Schloss Elmau during the Weimar Republic.

Although Johannes Müller at times supported the National Socialist ideology, the Nazis regarded him as unreliable because he was against the persecution of the Jews. He pre-empted the expropriation of Schloss Elmau by leasing it to the Wehrmacht as a home for soldiers on leave from the front.

After the end of World War II, Elmau was requisitioned by the United States Army and used as a military hospital for a short time. Two of Müller's children leased it from the Bavarian State Government after the end of the War and established both a hotel and a tradition of cultural events and political debates with prominent guests there.

Following a fire in 2005 which destroyed large parts of the building, one of Müller's grandchildren, Dieter Müller-Elmau, rebuilt Schloss Elmau and enlarged it into a world-class luxury spa and cultural hideaway.


